











#### **JOBKEEPER**

- **7** Businesses eligible for JobKeeper have experienced a decline in revenue of at least 30%.
- 7 Higher levels of JobKeeper applications are a likely indicator of greater negative economic impacts from COVID-19.
- ▶ In Frankston City it is estimated that 24.8% of local businesses have applied for JobKeeper support, down from a peak of 55.7% in August 2020.












