Description

Lexton, Little Boggy Creek and Stevens Reserves are a system of interlinked reserves in Langwarrin, 7 km east of the Frankston CBD. Combined, the reserves comprise approximately 13 ha of remnant bushland. Residential development surrounds much of the reserves, with a quarry and cleared land located to the west and north. Use of the reserves is primarily for walking and recreational activities.

Assets at risk

- Local residences

Fire history

No fires have been previously recorded within any of these reserves. Fire activity has occurred in reserves in the area to south-west.

Fire scenario

A fire may spread into these reserves from vegetation to the west or south-west under north-westerly or south-westerly winds. A fire within the reserves may be of relatively high intensity, but short duration. A fire in the reserves may pose a threat to life and property, particularly development the borders the reserve on its eastern boundaries.
