#### WELCOME FROM THE MAYOR

As part of the Frankston Cemetery Trust (Trust) and under the Cemeteries and Crematoria Act 2003, the Trust must meet at least once annually. These meetings are held for the purpose of keeping the Trust informed regarding matters relation to the Frankston Memorial Park in particular and current issued pertaining to management of cemeteries in general, in addition to authorising certain actions.

Notes since the Cemetery Trust Meeting, a revised cost plan is being obtained for the design changes, it is proposed to reallocate the Memorial Park toilet capital works funding to fund the delivery of the Caretaker House refurbishment this financial year, which will be committed as part of the mid-year Budget review. Then delay delivery of the Memorial Park toilet to 2022-2023 pending funding in the Capital Works Program allocation;
- 4. Notes the Frankston Memorial Park fees CPI increase, which came into effect on 1 July 2021, as set by the Department of Health and Human Services; and
- Notes the update provided outlining the continued improvements at Frankston Memorial Park.





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

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







## Caretakers Residence Refurbishment

- Budget for delivery this FY is \$302K.











## **Toilet Refurbishment**


- Refurbishment of existing toilet building to create a modern and accessible public toilet along with a new area to be used for memorial plaques. External landscaping and seating also included.
- Construction planned for 22/23 FY with completion scheduled for September 2022. Project has a budget of approximately \$235K.







#### 4.4 Park Maintenance Update

Frankston Memorial Park is currently mowed on a fortnightly basis. As the weather starts to cool off we will start to mow less frequently as the grass will begin to go into dormancy. Gardens are attended to twice a week, which includes weed spraying, any reactive works, rubbish removal and general horticultural maintenance.

There have been several unsightly self-seeded trees removed throughout the grounds, resulting in a better overall appearance as well as the removal of tree limbs that posed a danger to the public.

#### 5.5 Park Management Update

Over the past twelve months, Frankston Memorial Park has overseen 26 Burials and interments, 27 Plaques were sold and installed, 9 Memorial sites were reserved for ashes only and 15 Monumental Mason applications were approved.

A project for GIS mapping of gravesites is underway to enable improved location information. Recent updates of the GIS software mean it is now possible to zoom further in to view each grave site. This project will assist Council staff in locating grave sites and eventually assist families searching for the grave sites of their loved ones.
