Logical sequencing of street numbers helps to identify properties. Frankston City Council endeavours to allocate logical numbering within existing street numbering constraints.

Who is responsible for the allocation of street numbers and addresses?

Council is responsible for the allocation of street numbers and the addressing of properties in accordance with the *Local Government Act 1989* and relevant Naming Rules and Street Addressing Standards.

Developers and builders are not to allocate street numbers. Any numbering on plans, including lot, warehouse/factory, unit etc. is indicative only and may be changed in accordance with Rural and Urban Street Addressing Standards.

What are my responsibilities?

Owners and occupiers of residential, commercial and industrial properties – including owners of vacant land – are required by law to display the correct, Council-approved street number at the front of their property and on the letterbox.
