Registration is covered for you; all you need to do is sign up and start trading! ASPIRE connects small businesses (with 20 employees or less) to reuse and recycle items like soil, paper, metals, fabrics, plastics, and more.

Annual Business Survey results are in!

The results from the 2025 Frankston City Annual Business Survey are in and it was a huge success! With **186 local businesses** participating between 1–19 September, the insights gathered will help Council's Economic Development team shape programs and support that truly reflect your business support needs.

Respondents represented key areas including Frankston, Carrum Downs and Seaford, and top industries such as Retail, Professional Services, Construction, and Manufacturing.


Encouragingly, 52% expect to grow their workforce, with 77% considering employing young people aged 15–24 in the next year.

Businesses also praised Council services with **96%** reporting they were satisfied with direct Economic Development support.

Respondents also requested more business events (30%) and training opportunities (24%), which we look forward to delivering next year.


