



Canopy Tree Guide

Clause 55 Standard B2-7 Reference

This guide has been developed to provide a consistent and transparent approach to calculating canopy cover under the Victorian State Government's new Clause 55 Standard B2-7 for Tree Canopy. Its purpose is to ensure fairness in planning assessments by standardising the expected mature dimensions of commonly used tree species. By reducing ambiguity and avoiding unrealistic expectations under prevailing site conditions within our municipality¹, this guide helps to achieve meaningful greening outcomes.

This document is maintained as a [live resource](#) and will be updated monthly until the list is deemed comprehensive. It does not represent a complete list of accepted tree species. Council welcomes and encourages applicants to propose unlisted species for review.

¹ Council's estimate for mature tree height and canopy width are based on local growing conditions and relevant geological factors, including climate and soil type. The estimates also account for cultural and practical constraints that influence growth and performance in multi-dwelling urban environments, such as hostile growing conditions (e.g., heat stress, soil compaction, and limited water availability). For deep soil area and minimum plan dimension requirements, refer to Clause 55 Standard B2-7 of the Victorian Planning Scheme.

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
